THE VERDIGRIS KID

Sam McWilliams, aka the Verdigris Kid, was an outlaw and member of the Bill Cook Gang, who operated in Indian Territory in 1894.

Though the Cook Gang was short-lived, the gang was ruthless and known to shoot anyone who got in their way. Now, they've got hostages in the general store. You and the posse have to be careful, but you're determined that the Cook Gang will not get away!

Ammo

5 pistol (10 for two-gun shooters), 10 rifle, 4 shotgun, pocket pistol or derringer

Starting Position

Standing in window at firing line, pistol(s) safely holstered.

Pocket pistol/Derringer safely staged on table.

Rifle, loaded with ten rounds, safely staged.

Shotgun safely staged, four shotshells on shooter.

Procedure

When ready, say "*You can't flee, Verdigris!*"

At the buzzer, engage pistol targets. 1-2-3-4-5. Two-gun shooters, repeat. Make pistol(s) safe.

Engage rifle targets in a Nevada Sweep (1-2-3-4-3-2-1-2-3-4). Make rifle safe.

Engage shotgun 1-2-1-2. Make shotgun safe.

Engage Pocket pistol/Derringer target for bonus.

Time stops.



CATFISH KID

Catfish Kid - A Texas outlaw, the "kid" reportedly killed deputy Sheriff L.S. Pierce in a gunfight and was imprisoned for murder. After a bold prison break, in which the kid swam out through the prison's garden irrigation ditch, you and the posse have tracked him to the banks of the Rio Grande, where you're hoping to reel in this hombre!

Ammo

5 pistol (10 for two-gun shooters), 10 rifle, 4 shotgun.

Starting Position

Shooter standing at firing line, behind rock, loaded pistol(s) holstered, shotgun and rifle safe in stand.

Procedure

When ready, shooter says, *"Catfish, you're in the fryer now!"*

At the buzzer, engage pistol targets, 1-2-3-2-1. Two-gun shooters, repeat. Safely holster pistol(s).

Move to rifle and engage rifle targets, 1-2-3-1-2-3-1-2-3-1. Make rifle safe.

Move back to shotgun and engage shotgun targets, 1-2-1-2. Make shotgun safe.

Time stops.



NED CHRISTIE, THE CHEROKEE KID

Ned Christie, aka, The Cherokee Kid, is a Cherokee Indian outlaw, and a horse thief who killed Marshal Dan Maples and others. You and the posse have him in your sights near the Cherokee Nation Reservation. But, he's not giving up easily!

Ammo

5 pistol (10 for two-gun shooters), 10 rifle, 4 shotgun, derringer/pocket pistol.

Starting Position

Standing at fence, loaded pistol(s) safely holstered.

Rifle, loaded with ten rounds, and Shotgun safely staged, four shotshells on shooter.

Procedure

When ready, say "*Cherokee, I'm comin' in a-blazin'!*"


At the buzzer, engage pistol targets, 1-5-2-4-3. Two-gun shooters, repeat. Make pistol safe.

Move to rifle and engage rifle targets, 1-2-2-3-3-3-4-4-4-4. Make rifle safe.

Retrieve shotgun and engage shotgun targets, 1-2-3-4. Make shotgun safe.

Engage derringer/pocket pistol targets for bonus.

Time stops.



HARRY THE KID

Harry Head, aka Harry the Kid (18??-1881), was a cattle rustler and stage robber in southern Arizona. Head was known to cavort with the likes of the Clanton Gang. On March 15, 1881, Head, along with outlaws Bill Leonard and Jim Crane, ambushed a stagecoach about a mile outside Contention, Arizona. The coach, carrying \$26,000 in Wells Fargo money and eight passengers, was waylaid while trying to navigate a steep grade. Guarded by lawman, Bob Paul, gunfire erupted and stagecoach driver Budd Philpot and a passenger were killed. In the meantime, the horses bolted. Bob Paul got the stage under control, and the would-be robbers fled. The fugitives soon found a price on their head of \$2,000 dead or alive. You and the posse have come to collect!

Ammo

5 Pistol (10 for two-gun shooters), 10 Rifle, 6 shotgun

Starting Position

Standing behind wagon, pistol(s) safely holstered loaded.

Rifle, loaded with ten rounds, safely staged on wagon.

Shotgun staged on right, six shotshells on shooter.

Procedure

When ready, say *"I've come to collect one Harry Head!"*

At the buzzer, engage rifle targets in a Nevada Sweep; (1-2-3-4-3-2-1-2-3-4).

Make rifle safe.

Move to engage shotgun targets 1-2-3-1-2-3. Make shotgun safe.

Engage pistol targets in a sweep; (1-2-3-4-5). Two-gun shooters, repeat.

Make pistol safe.

Time stops.



4. GAME ON

Scenario

On the way back from Phoenix, the train comes to a screeching halt, the rails blocked by a herd of grazing Buffalo. They don't want to move, so the conductor invites those with firearms to coerce the cagey critters to convene somewhere's else. You don't want to kill them, just want them to move off the tracks, so you and some other armed arbitrators pick out rocks to shoot at, hoping that the blast, dust, and exploding pieces of rock will be enough to scare off the big critters.

Ammo

10 Rifle, 5 pistol (10, for two-gun shooters), 10 Rifle caliber rifle, or 10 .22 caliber rifle

Starting Position

Standing with safely holstered pistol(s),
Rifle safely held at Cowboy Port Arms, or
Shooter in position with single-shot rifle

Procedure

When ready, yell *"Let the game begin!"*

At the buzzer, pistol shooters engage pistol targets in the following order 1 2 1 2 1 (two-gun shooters repeat),

Rifle caliber rifle, engage targets in the following order 1 2 1 2 1 2 1 2 1 2,

Single-shot rifle shooters engage targets in the following order: 1 2 1 2 1 2 1 2 1 2.

Time stops.

Targets

2 long range rifle, 2 pistol caliber rifle, .22 gallery target (weather permitting)

THE VERDIGRIS KID

When the two officers arrived, they shot the Verdigris Kid and Deputy Marshal Barbee opened fire on the rest of the gang. George Sanders was also killed, and Sam Butler, though wounded, escaped. McWilliams was 19 years old.

THE COOK GANG

Though the Cook Gang was short-lived, the gang was ruthless and known to shoot anyone who got in their way. Starting small, the gang first began by stealing horses and selling whiskey, before they quickly advanced to robbing banks, stores and stagecoaches. As the months progressed, most of the members of the gang, including leaders Bill Cook and Cherokee Bill Goldsby were killed or arrested. However, Cook Gang members, Sam McWilliams and George Sanders were still at large. In April, 1895, Sam "Verdigris Kid" McWilliams, George Sanders and Sam Butler rode into Braggs, Oklahoma, ordering everyone to put up their hands. The trio of outlaws quickly marched their prisoners to the Madden General Store and when the store clerk panicked and ran into the street, the outlaws shot him down. As their hostages stood waiting, the thieves robbed the general store and exchanged their clothing and boots for new ones. One of the hostages was then sent to bring a horse to the store, exchanging it for one of theirs. Fortunately, the owner of the store was not present, but could see the robbery taking place and quickly reported it to two law officers, one of whom was U.S. Deputy Marshal Barbee.

A few months later, in June, 1881, the three outlaws attempted another robbery at a store in Eureka, New Mexico. However, owners Bill and Ike Heslett fought back and Harry Head and Bill Leonard were killed. Crane was able to escape and later orchestrated the killings of both Heslett brothers.
